

ABOUT THE MUSIC:

Edvard Grieg wrote two suites based on Ibsen's play "Peer Gynt." IN THE HALL OF THE MOUNTAIN KING is the fourth movement of Suite I, Opus 46, written in 1874. The nationalistic flavor evident in the music of Norway's most eminent composer comes through very clearly in this part of the suite, offering a complementary contrast to the other three movements.

IN THE HALL OF THE MOUNTAIN KING is a study in accelerando and crescendo. From the pianissimo of the opening measures to the triple forte of the final note, it will be necessary to maintain an ever-increasing surge of sound. Even between #50-74 (marked forte) there should be a developing intensity, assisted of course by increasing tempo.

The problem of tempo is similar but less clearly defined. My source (Kalmus Miniature Score #20) gives only an initial metronome marking: $\text{♩} = 138$. The metronome markings given here are from a recording by the Philadelphia Orchestra, Eugene Ormandy conducting. However, they are only guidelines by which, along with other score directions, performing groups may work toward musical effectiveness. Note that the change to $\frac{2}{2}$ at #66 will require special attention, one important step in the long and gradual tempo change.

All other concerns, including the need for a clear articulate style, should be obvious. It is the pacing of the dynamics and tempo that will be most troublesome. Successful handling of these two elements should ensure a successful performance.
