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To The Director

Mist is a calm and peaceful composition influenced by the impressionist style. Listening to both the piano and orchestral music of Claude Debussy will help your students understand the style of this piece.

The opening section is slow and unhurried. The middle section (measures 27 through 61) is a little faster. Don't be too conservative with the accelerandos and ritards. Allow the music to alternately move and slow down.

The musical climax occurs in measure 58. The harmonic tension gradually relaxes as a return to the "A" section occurs at measure 62. Strive for a nice legato bowing technique throughout this piece.
