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1910 · The Boy Scouts of America and the Camp Fire Girls of America are founded. Fanny Brice, age 19, moves from burlesque to the Ziegfeld Follies, earning \$18 per week. The decade of American ballroom dancing begins -- trendy restaurants install dance floors, and the afternoon "dansant" becomes popular. Fueled by brisk parlor piano sales, two billion copies of sheet music are sold in the U.S. for between 25¢ and 35¢ each, and George V becomes King of England.
